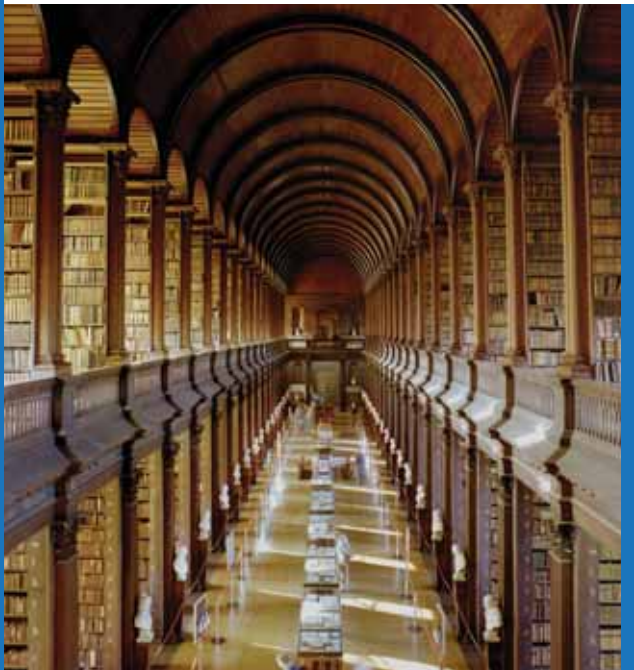
- Study at one of the world's leading universities

International Peace Studies is the only Masters degree in Trinity that provides an interdisciplinary approach to understanding the political, economic, ethnic and inter-generational character of armed conflict and war. It examines the conditions for achieving sustainable peace through conflict resolution, mediation, peacebuilding and nonviolence. The programme draws on the fields of international relations, politics, human rights, sociology, philosophy, ethics, development and gender studies in the pursuit of a comprehensive understanding of war and peace. Our graduates are employed in the diplomatic service, in NGOs and international organisations such as the UN, in media and education. Others continue to PhD programmes.
