Specialized Research Themes:

Religion and Politics: globalization; religion and ethics; religious fundamentalism; religion, modernity and post-modernity; religion and migration; evangelical politics

Interreligious Studies: world religions and comparative theology; interreligious dialogue; Buddhism; Judaism; Hinduism; Islam

Politics of Peace and Conflict: ethics of non-violence; peacebuilding and conflict prevention; civil society; comparative peace processes; political science approaches to conflict resolution; religion, reconciliation and peacebuilding in Northern Ireland, Southern Africa, Central America and other contexts

Intercultural Theology: cross-cultural processes of Christianity; Christian theologies in Asia, Africa, and in the Islamic world; migrant churches and cross-cultural ministry
